

2020 DALLAS/FORT WORTH ACAP FINAL REPORT

Sixty-three (63) high school students applied to DFW ACAP by the April 30, 2020 deadline date.

However, due to COVID-19, the DFW ACAP Leadership Team decided to postpone the weeklong residency (onsite) camps at Southern Methodist University (SMU) in June and the inaugural program at Texas Christian University (TCU) in July as previously planned. In lieu of those onsite programs, DFW ACAP provided the following alternatives:

- Included the 2020 ACAP applicants (47 freshmen through juniors) on the ACAP Distribution List for upcoming ACAP Monthly e-Newsletters to encourage their continued interest in ACAP for Summer 2021.
- Offered scholarships to those 2020 graduating seniors (16) who applied to ACAP by the April 30, 2020 deadline date and met the established ACAP Scholarship criteria.
- Offered a 1-1/2day virtual program for those 2020 graduating seniors (16) who applied to ACAP by the April 30, 2020 deadline date.

The students came from 33 different high schools. The average GPA was **3.64**; the highest being 5.41. Other demographics of the applicant pool were as follows:

SMU SCHOLARSHIP



The new scholarship is awarded to all Dallas ACAP alumni who enroll in SMU Cox's nine-month Master of Science in Accounting program, regardless of where they completed their undergraduate degree. "It increases our outreach by bringing these students back to SMU, and back to Cox, to participate in our graduate program," says Steve Denson, SMU Cox's Director of Diversity. Ashlee Jones, a 2015 and 2016 Dallas ACAP alumna, was named as the new scholarship's first recipient earlier this summer. "Dallas ACAP was my first time being surrounded by a large amount of minority students who had goals similar to mine," Jones says. "ACAP helped develop my leadership skills.
