

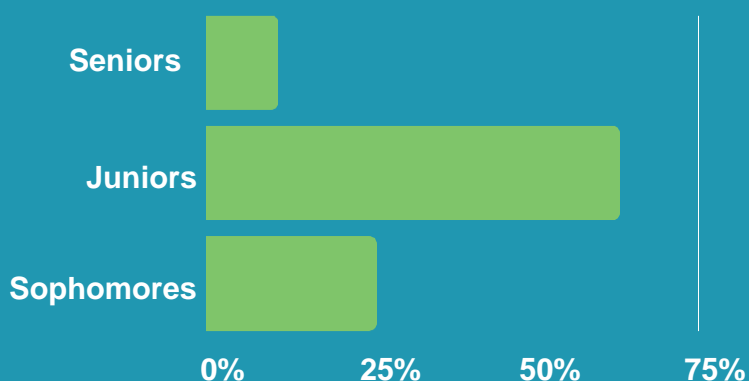

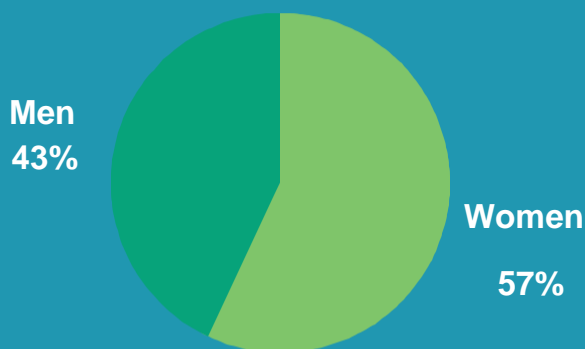

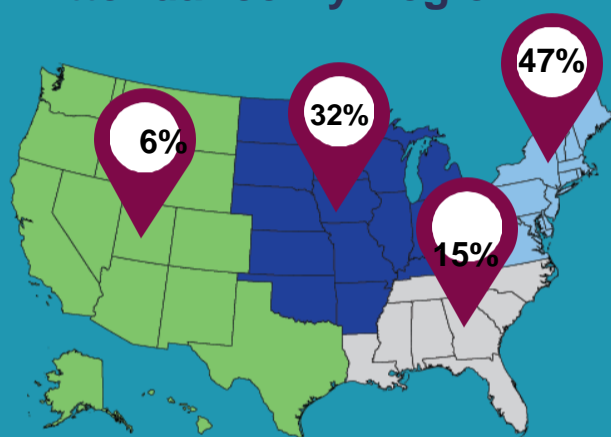
High School Year

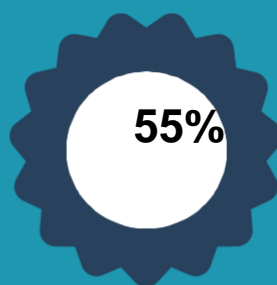

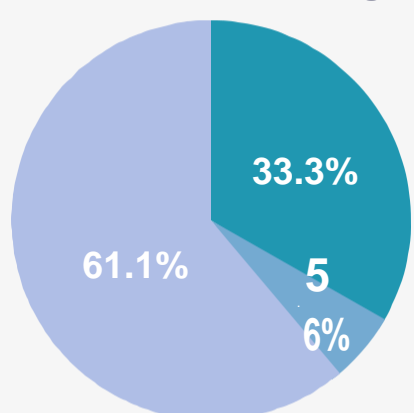

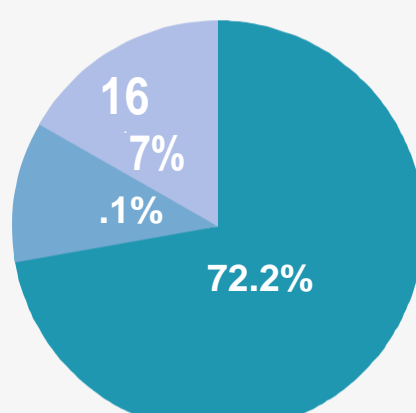
