Date (Period)	Opportunity	Nature of Service Required
May 1 – May 15	Student Interviews	Using an established process and scoring rubric, the ACAP Interviewer will virtually interview ACAP Applicants on designated dates and at designated times. Interviewer Huddle (training) is scheduled.
June 1 – July 31	Mentor	Committed individuals are asked to serve as mentors to ACAP students during the immediate weeks prior to ACAP Week and for some time post-ACAP as desired. There are more specific notes as to what this mentor/mentee relationship should look like.
July 27 – July 2	ACAP Counselor	Committed and student-centered individuals serve as counselors and mentors to an assigned group of students. There is an application and screening process. There is ACAP Orientation.
June 27 – July 2	Session Speaker	During ACAP, selected professionals will facilitate targeted sessions or participate in panel discussions. See separate document for curriculum and course descriptions.
June 27 – July 2	Group Project Advisor	The Group Project is the capstone project. During ACAP Week, students will act as young entrepreneurs and decide what type of business they are in and/or what products or services they will provide. Each Project Team will pitch its products or services idea to a group of potential clients/customers who act as judges. Business professionals may be assigned to each project team as an advisor or mentor.
June 27 – July 2	Scholarship Interviewer	Selected individuals interview those graduating seniors who apply for the ACAP scholarships. A scholarship process and scoring rubric are used.
Ju1y 1	Group Project Judge	Selected business professionals serve as judges of the Group Project Presentations. A grading process and rubric are used to document the results.
July 1	Talent Show Judge	Selected individuals serve as judges for the Talent Show. A grading rubric is used in the process.
